

The 46-acre Irish Cultural Centre of Greater Boston is a cultural masterpiece, 35 years in the making. What began as a noble dream in the 1980s is today a fulsome, year round facility that ably represents the vibrant Irish-American community in New England, where nearly 20% of all residents have Irish roots. amateur sporting associations in the world.
