# **IRISH CULTURAL HUBS**

There are numerous Irish hubs throughout New England but these are special during St. Patrick's Day season.

### CANTON, MA

The Irish Cultural Centre of Greater Boston is a year-round headquarters for the Irish community, with special energy on St. Patrick's Day weekend, with live music and dancing, parties and family events, mass services and luncheons and plenty of fun.

#### LAWRENCE, MA

The Ancient Order of Hibernians local chapter organizes events all month long, starting with the annual Irish flag raising ceremony at City Hall, followed by live music and dance, lectures, luncheons, movies and exhibits.

## LOWELL, MA

The 42nd Irish Cultural Week runs from March 10-17, 2025, and features multiple events throughout the city, especially around St. Patrick's Church, the hub of the community. Enjoy Irish Acre walking tours, lectures, concerts, award presentations and more.

# **NEWPORT, RI**

The March 15 parade is the centerpiece of Newport's celebration, and you'll also find events at the Museum of Newport Irish History, at local pubs and restaurants. Irish history and heritage walks at churches and cemeteries are fun too.
